Research.gov lets you search for and find Recovery Act awards made by NSF!

**Research.gov's** *Research Spending and Results* gives the public, the scientific community, and Congress insight into federally-funded research. *Research Spending and Results* is an online service providing information about how Federal research dollars are being spent, what research is being performed, and how the outcomes of research are benefiting society as a whole. Anyone can easily access, search, and sort information in new ways through Research.gov.

### Search Recovery Act Awards through Research.gov in two easy steps:

Research.gov displays awards active as of FY 1994 and beyond for NSF and active as of FY 2007 and beyond for NASA. Please note information may not be as complete for awards that date prior to the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (awards not active as of October 2006 and beyond).

#### Step 2:

Check the box *Show me only Recovery Act Awards* and click *Search*.

The capability to search for Recovery Act awards applies only to NSF awards at this time.  
The capability to search for NASA Recovery Act Awards may be available in the future.

## Advanced Search Options:

You can refine your search using an additional 21 search criteria, including program, awardee, and keywords (including field of science).

Your search results will appear. You can:

- Sort your results by a variety of fields, including awardee and awardee location by clicking on the column headers.
- Click on the *Federal Award ID Number* for details on an award, such as the award abstract and funds obligated to date.
- Export your results to CSV, Excel, or XML for further sorting and analysis.
